TITLE: FLYING FLAGS AT HALF-MAST ON MUNICIPAL PROPERTY

EFFECTIVE DATE: May 15, 2006

FLYING FLAGS AT HALF-MAST ON MUNICIPAL PROPERTY

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this policy is to establish the protocol with respect to the half-masting of flags on Municipal property.

LOCATION:

This policy shall apply to flags at the following locations:

- 1) City Hall
- 2) City O.P.P. Headquarters
- 3) Mount Pelion

Other locations may be included at the discretion of the Mayor.

OCCASIONS:

Flags at the designated locations shall be lowered to half-mast on the following occasions:

- 1) November 11, Remembrance Day
- 2) Death of the following (while in office):
 - a) Reigning Sovereign or member of Royal Family related in the first degree (husband, wife, son, daughter, mother, father, brother or sister)
 - b) Governor General of Canada
 - c) Lieutenant Governor of Ontario
 - d) Prime Minister of Canada
 - e) Premier of Ontario
 - f) Local M.P.
 - g) Local M.P.P.

- h) Mayor, City of Quinte West
- i) Councillor, City of Quinte West
- j) Employee, City of Quinte West
- k) Board or Committee member appointed by Council
- I) Quinte West O.P.P. officer
- 3) Death of the following:
 - a) Former Prime Minister
 - b) Former Premier of Ontario
 - c) Former Local M.P.
 - d) Former Local M.P.P.
 - e) Former Mayor
- 4) On the date, when fallen Canadian Armed Forces members are repatriated to Canada at Canadian Forces Base Trenton.
- 5) On any day declared by the Federal Government, the Provincial Government or the Council of the City of Quinte West as a day of mourning.

DURATION FOR FLYING FLAGS AT HALF-MAST:

When it is appropriate that flags be at half-mast the period shall commence upon notification of the death and last until sunset of the day of the funeral or memorial service, or in the case of Clause 4 only on the day of repatriation, unless otherwise directed by the Mayor or Council.
