### WOOLER ROAD/COUNTY ROAD 40 CNR/CPR OVERPASS BRIDGE

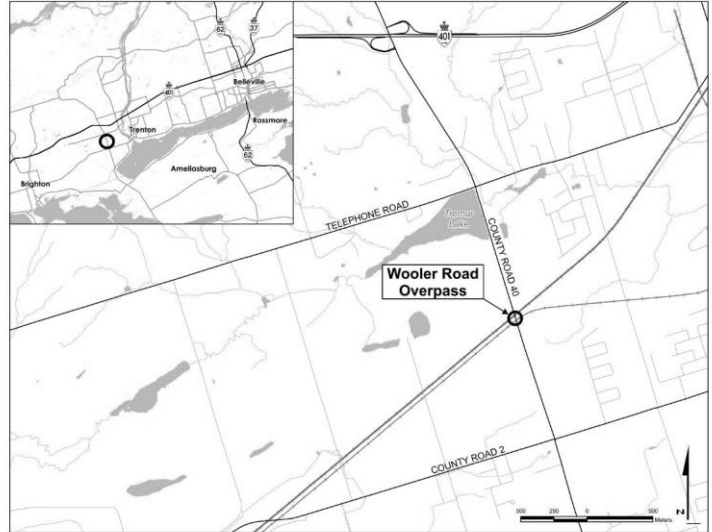
### MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT (SCHEDULE B)

#### THE STUDY

The City of Quinte West initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to identify, develop and implement a solution to address deficiencies noted in the Wooler Road (County Road 40) Canadian National Railway (CNR)/ Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) Overpass Bridge, located approximately 2.3 km south of Highway 401 and 950 m north of Highway 2, as illustrated on the key map below.

The MCEA study was carried out as a Schedule 'B' undertaking in accordance with the Class EA process (October 2000, amended 2007, 2011, 2015 and 2023), approved under the Ontario *Environmental Assessment Act*.

Through consultation with Agencies, Members of the Public, and Indigenous Communities, the Technically Preferred Alternative for the Wooler Road CNR/CPR overpass bridge is Like-for-like Full Structure Replacement in its the current location. The evaluation and the resulting recommendation were made public through an online Public Information Centre on April 23, 2023.



#### Project File Report

In accordance with the Class EA process, a Project File Report (PFR) has been prepared to document the planning and decision-making process for this study.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested, how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy those potential adverse impacts, and any information in support of the statements in the request.
