Whether you're aiming for a stroll or seeking scenic vistas, Quinte West offers a multitude of trails suitable for individuals of varying skill levels. Particularly noteworthy are the two trail sections that meander along the stunning Bay of Quinte waterfront. These trails feature smooth pavements and level terrain, making them accessible to the entire family-perfect for cycling, rollerblading, walking with strollers, or navigating with wheelchairs. For outdoor adventurers and novice hikers, Hanna Park is home to beautiful trails and the city's off-leash dog park. Within this picturesque forested area, diverse routes await exploration, catering to different preferences and abilities.

#### THESE VIEWS NEVER GET OLD

Quinte West has two distinct observation towers offering some of the region's most breathtaking views and are ideal for capturing stunning photos. Experience the view from the summit of Mount Pelion in Trenton, where you'll see the cityscape and the scenic expanse of the Bay of Quinte. At Sager Conservation Area's observation deck, enjoy a sweeping 360-degree view of the beautiful Oak Hills. Remember that both locations involve climbing several stairs before reaching the observation towers. The steps to the scenic views are worth the workout!

#### **CONSERVATION AT WORK**

Situated along the scenic Trent River waterfront, this urban greenspace offers abundant chances for leisurely strolls, cycling and observing wildlife along the Jack Lange Memorial Walkway, creating a seamless connection between the downtown area and Lock 1. Currently undergoing revitalization and restoration efforts, the site is being transformed to incorporate a vibrant wildflower garden, extra seating spaces, the addition of shadeproviding trees and the creation of a new pathway running alongside the water's edge.

#### THE BIGGEST ROCK IN GLEN MILLER

Seriously, this rock is huge. The Bleasdell Boulder can be found in the conservation area that bears its name just south of Batawa. It is one of North America's largest known glacial erratics, estimated to be 2.3 billion years old. The conservation area also has a 1.5 km trail loop. Enjoy the walking trails and the picture-perfect spots along the way.

#### **GET ACTIVE IN BATAWA**

Bring your water for a cardio workout on the trails in Batawa. Hike, bike or run over eight kilometres of wooded trails up and down the north and south sides of Batawa Ski Hill. Keep your eyes open for other trail users and signs on some trails indicating the directions of travel.



## BATAWA TRAILS: ESSENTIAL DO'S AND DON'TS FOR RIDERS OF ALL AGES

The Batawa trails are your ultimate destination for biking adventure in Quinte West! Just a stone's throw from Highway 401, the picturesque village of Batawa is home to both the renowned Batawa Ski Hill and a network of thrilling bike trails. Whether you're a beginner or a seasoned rider, Batawa has something for everyone. From a pump track, machined gravity trails, single track, and village trails leading to the Dino Dig and natural playground, there's no shortage of excitement to be found.

The key to a rewarding biking experience lies in knowing the essential do's and don'ts for riders of all ages and abilities. Here are some tips from Batawa's Trail Manager, who brings valuable insights as both an avid biker and a parent to a young mountain biker in training.

#### FAMILY RIDES WITH YOUNG CHILDREN

#### DO's

- Bring plenty of water and snacks. Ski hill patio picnic tables are available for public use unless there is a private event.
- Set realistic goals and expectations based on your children's age and experience level.
- Perform a pre-ride bike and helmet inspection. Pack your own first aid kit as the chalet is closed during the off-season.
- Warm up on the pump track to practice maneuvering your bicycle, test your equipment and have fun. Just remember, save some energy for the trails ahead!
- Introduce your kids to mountain biking on "Evergreen" trail first. Ride it in both directions before progressing to Maples trail. Keep in mind that Batawa South trails require climbing uphill. The natural limitations of age and strength can limit even very skilled young riders.
- Engage kids in route planning by reviewing trail maps and identifying wayfinding markers along the trails.
- Wrap up the biking adventure with playtime at the Dino Dig or Natural Playground, accessible via village gravel trails.

#### **DON'Ts**

- Don't worry about washrooms; there is a porta-potty in the main parking lot.
- Don't push little ones too hard. End the adventure positively by gauging their energy levels and concluding before exhaustion sets in.
- Don't ride the mountain bike trails on a super windy day. Strong winds can startle young riders and increase the risk of falling debris, compromising safety.

#### NOVICE & INTERMEDIATE MOUNTAIN BIKERS

#### DO's

- Conduct a safety check of your bike and helmet before every ride.
- Visit batawaskihill.com to understand and adhere to the "Rules of the Trail", ensuring respect for the trails and fellow riders.
- Explore all the machined gravity Batawa South trails, including Wild Turkey, the sole single-track trail on the south side.
- Ride the Batawa South trails frequently to improve your skills and cardiovascular fitness.
- After mastering the South Side trails, venture onto the more challenging singletrack trails on the North Side, where you'll encounter advanced uphill and downhill sections.
- Get involved with group rides hosted by Doug's Bicycle to further develop your skills and connect with other riders.
- Engage with the Quinte MTB community on Facebook to access trail information and opportunities for involvement in trail maintenance and trail building initiatives.

#### **DON'Ts**

- Don't ride trails that exceed your current skill level. Stay informed about skills clinics offered by Batawa Ski Hill via Facebook or Instagram.
- Don't forget your bug spray.
- Don't get lost. Download the Trail Forks app for live maps.


## 2024 CANADA SOCCER TOYOTA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS U-15 CUP



## **Q&A with Andrew Belej** from the Trent Port Marina
