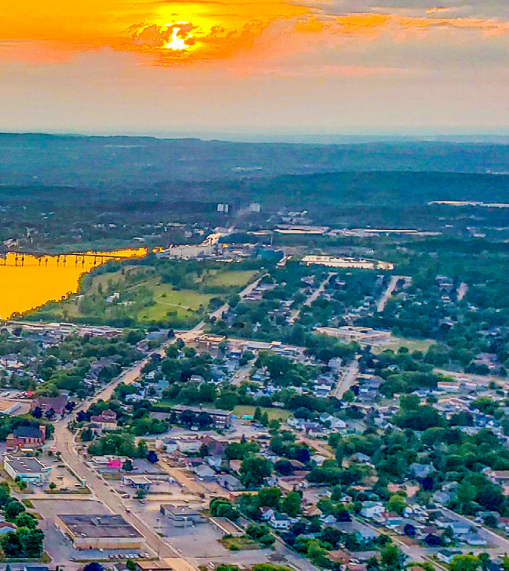

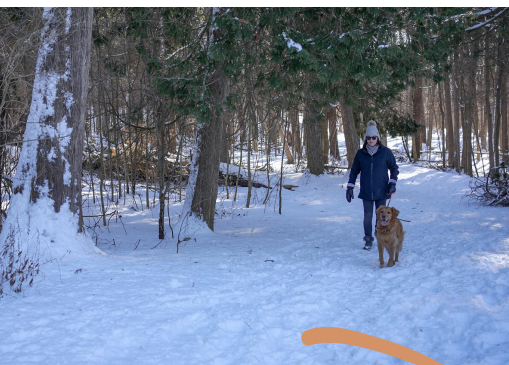

PARKS AND PLAY

OUTDOOR RECREATION IN QUINTE WEST



Quinte West offers the perfect mix of parks, trails and amenities for everyone. Begin with a stroll along the Bay of Quinte waterfront by the Trent Port Marina. The paved trail is ideal for walking, cycling, or wheelchairs, offering stunning views and is accessible for all. For a nature escape, head to Hanna Park in Trenton, a 42-acre forested haven with marked trails, tennis courts, a children's play area and an **off-leash dog park**.

Centennial Park in Trenton is a must-visit with a splash pad, skate park, sports fields and the **Trenton Lions Inclusive Playground**, designed for children of all abilities. Starting at the Pop-ups is a circular waterfront trail that winds through the park along the shores of the Bay of Quinte.

In Frankford, enjoy the Trent River at the Frankford Tourist Park and Campground. With a **playground, skate park, beach** and beautiful views, it's a hub for outdoor fun and relaxation. Only a short distance away is the Frankford Splash Park. Located in Frankford, along North Trent Street, Bata Island's entrance can be found opposite to Huffman Road. A walkway with trails branching off also runs through the park.

Stop in Batawa for the Batawa Lions Natural Playground, featuring a zipline, and climbing areas, and head to Batawa Ski Hill for a Dinosaur Dig where you can uncover a **life-sized replica T. Rex skeleton** and other paleontology activities. Don't forget to bring a pail and shovel.

URBAN OASIS

REVITALIZING OUR WATERFRONT AND GREEN SPACE

Restoring the Trenton Greenbelt:

A Conversation with Manager, Community Outreach and Special Projects, Anne Anderson, and Communications Specialist, Corinne Ross, of Lower Trent Conservation

When Lower Trent Conservation set out to restore the Trenton Greenbelt in 2022, it wasn't just about planting flowers, it was about transforming a simple lawn into a thriving ecosystem.

"We wanted to create a space where people and nature could truly connect," explains Corinne Ross. "That meant removing invasive species, restoring the soil and bringing in native plants like milkweed and goldenrod to attract pollinators and birds."

The changes didn't go unnoticed. One day, during a guided tour, a snapping turtle emerged, right on cue, to start building its nest. "It was the perfect example of why this project is so important," Ross says.

For Anne Anderson, strengthening the link between the Greenbelt and the Trent River has been just as crucial. "We want people to see this space as more than just a park—it's a living, breathing part of the community."

New educational signs now help visitors understand the area's biodiversity, and locals can contribute by logging species on iNaturalist. "It's a way for everyone to be part of conservation," Anderson says.

Looking ahead, the team envisions the Greenbelt as a model for urban restoration. A space in the heart of the City where families gather, wildlife flourishes and nature thrives.

And for those looking to explore more of Quinte West's green spaces, both Anderson and Ross recommend visiting Bleasdel Boulder, a stunning glacial erratic, or Sager Conservation Area, where a scenic lookout tower offers breathtaking views, especially in the fall. For a longer hike, the Lower Trent Trail connects it all, winding through forests, wetlands and along the river's edge.

A CITY OF TRAILS

Quinte West is known for being a natural attraction, and while here you'll have no problem finding dirt, gravel or paved trails with beautiful views. Home to both Lower Trent Conservation and Quinte Conservation, and over 40 parks managed by the City of Quinte West, the municipality offers diverse experiences for nature lovers and outdoor enthusiasts alike.

Hike the 1.5 km **Bleasdel Boulder** trail for a glimpse of North America's largest glacial erratics (almost three stories high). With a difficulty level of "easy", it is great for the whole family. Other easy trails include the 3 km Trenton **Greenbelt Conservation Area** and **South Potter's Creek Conservation Area**.

North Potter's Creek Conservation Area contains a mixture of meadows, forests and orchards where you can explore both an easy 4.6 km and a more intermediate 2.7 km trail. **Sidney Conservation Area** located in the Oak Hills area also has 1.6 km of medium-difficulty trails for you to experience.

For a more challenging hike, visit **Sager Conservation** where you climb .5 km straight up and comes with an additional tower to climb, giving you a breathtaking panoramic view of the countryside. For another exhilarating experience, climb **Mount Pelion**, accessed off of MacLellan Avenue in Trenton, to view the city's urban core and the Bay of Quinte.

STAY HYDRATED AND GET MOVING ON BATAWA'S TRAILS

Prepare for a great cardio workout as you explore over 8 km of wooded trails in Batawa. Whether you're hiking, biking or running, the trails wind up and down the north and south sides of Batawa Ski Hill, offering a fun and challenging experience. Be sure to watch for other trail users and follow the directional signs on certain paths to keep everyone moving safely.

A Discussion with Deanna Way:

Executive Director of the Quinte Museum of Natural History (QMNH)

Deanna Way's path to becoming the Executive Director of QMNH in 2022 has been shaped by a deep interest in history and museums. "My education in History and Museum Studies led me to pursue an internship at the National Air Force Museum of Canada, which was a pivotal moment," she says. After gaining experience in fossil preparation at local company Research Casting International, and later in art conservation in Ottawa, she then returned to Quinte West, bringing her skills and expertise back to the community.

At QMNH, Deanna focuses on education and environmental awareness. "We aim to empower our visitors, showing them what biodiversity means and how they fit into it," she explains. She's particularly proud of exhibits like *Lights, Camera, Action: T-Rex in Film*, which shows how films have shaped people's views of dinosaurs and prehistoric life.

Looking to the future, Deanna is excited about upcoming exhibits, including one on Canada's Arctic and its biodiversity, and another that will explore local ecology while introducing a seed library to preserve native plants. For her, it's all about connecting people to the world around them and creating a space where learning and community thrive.



CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

TRENTON TOWN HALL - 1861

Home of the Trent Port Historical Society, the Trenton Town Hall 1861 is one of Quinte West's most noticeable landmarks. Established as a multi-purpose building, the Trenton Town Hall served as a space for municipal offices, a police station, a courtroom and a farmers' market. In 1981, the Trent Port Historical Society was established to preserve the history of Trenton through photographs, documents and artifacts. With the formation of Quinte West (from the amalgamation of Trenton, Sidney, Frankford and Murray), the scope of preservation expanded. Moving into the digital age, the Trent Port Historical Society is modernizing their collection records with the capability to share the information with the community and beyond.

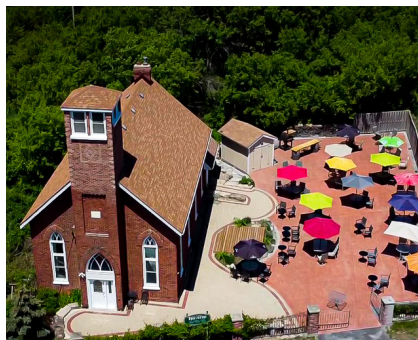

A Conversation with Kevin Windsor:

Executive Director of the National Air Force Museum of Canada (NAFMC)

Kevin Windsor's journey to the role of Executive Director at the National Air Force Museum of Canada began after graduating from Cape Breton University's Heritage Preservation and Conservation program. "My first role was at the Westfield Heritage Village, followed by time at the Stratford Perth Museum and the City of Niagara Falls," Kevin shares. "In 2012, I joined the NAFMC as Curator, and became the Executive Director in 2018."

For Kevin, preserving Canadian Air Force history is about more than just the aircraft on display. "We aim to tell the full story of Canada's Air Force, from aircraft to personal artifacts like diaries, uniforms and flags," he explains. He believes that preserving these items is key to understanding your Air Force legacy and its impact on Canadian history.

Looking ahead, Kevin is particularly excited about the new Eyes on the Skies exhibit, which will focus on air traffic control and the history of aviation in Canada. "It's a new chapter for the museum, and we're excited to partner with 8 Wing/CFB Trenton to bring it to life," he says. Eyes on the Skies, a traveling exhibit produced by the Canadian Aviation and Space Museum in partnership with NAV CANADA, will be at the NAFMC from May 31 to Aug. 24, 2025.

For Kevin, the NAFMC isn't just about preserving the past; it's about ensuring that history continues to inform and inspire future generations.

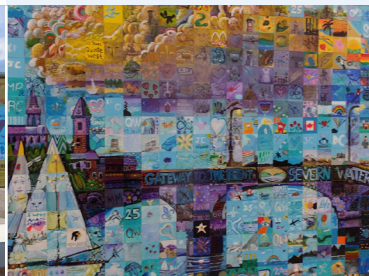

The Bay of Quinte is well known as one of North America's premier fishing destinations for both recreational and competitive anglers. The Bay of Quinte offers beautiful sunrises and sunsets, and the fish species are varied and plentiful.

Quinte West stands out as a prime fishing tournament hub. When we asked tournament coordinators what stood out about hosting angling events on the Bay of Quinte, many of them claimed the same thing: that Quinte West checks every box.

Its diverse ecosystem makes it a top location for both competitive and recreational anglers. The bay has plenty of large and smallmouth bass, northern pike, perch, crappie and muskie. "A well-stocked and multispecies fishery means there is something to suit every interest," explains

John Grandy, president of the Quinte Bass Anglers and the Canadian Bass Anglers Federation, which host annual tournaments in the area. "Tournament fishing is largely catch-and-release, which provides sustainability for the sport."

Beyond the incredible fishing, Quinte West is an accessible and well-equipped tournament destination. "Not only is the Bay of Quinte easily accessible from the 401, but Quinte West offers excellent launch facilities and plenty of boat and trailer parking," says Craig Butler, a member of Ontario Bass Nation. "Not only are the launches top-notch, but they are free to use, which is very welcomed by anglers wanting to get out and explore the bay."

"Weather plays a significant role in any fishing tournament, and the Bay of Quinte offers a relatively sheltered environment compared to larger, open-water tournaments on Lake Ontario," points out Joe Ford, vice president of the Canadian International Sportfishing Association and owner of charter company Joe Ford Fishing

and Outdoors. He often brings private fishing tours to the bay and explains that "there are excellent shorelines and parks in Quinte West that you can fish from without even needing a boat."

Tournament anglers arrive up to a week in advance to pre-fish and test the waters to find their unique spots. David Chong of the North GTA Canadian Bass Anglers Federation appreciates the generous lodging options in the area and the excellent restaurants to choose from after a day on the water.

Andy Pallotta of the Competitive Sport Fishing League (CSFL), who hosts a sizeable multi-day event annually, says, "What I love most about coordinating angling tournaments on the Bay of Quinte is that Quinte West is a community that truly embraces these events. From gas stations, accommodators and tackle shops to waterfront restaurants, they understand the benefit of the influx of anglers to the area, making it a win-win for everyone involved. The City of Quinte West in particular has been incredibly supportive."

The most fulfilling aspect of organizing tournaments here is the sense of community. Tournament organizers and the anglers who participate return year after year share stories, form friendships and pass down traditions to the next generation. Quinte West isn't just a fishing hotspot, it's a gathering place for all types of anglers and a home for some of the most dedicated in the sport.

Fishing isn't exclusive to just boat owners. Public spaces along the Trent River provide ample opportunities for casting lines and reeling in big catches.

While the ice fishing season tends to be brief, it presents a family-friendly activity and a chance to enjoy the Canadian winter months outdoors. For those familiar with ice fishing, gather your auger and select a suitable spot for your fishing experience.

If you're new to fishing or unsure where to begin, consider contacting a seasoned expert who can arrange a fishing charter or a guided trip or provide the necessary equipment for ice fishing or open water, catering to the specific season.
